## MICE ARE EXHIBITED AT MANHATTAN CAT SHOW Rector leads U. S. Rodent fanciers



For the first time in its conservative life, the Empire Cat Club permitted the showing of mice and rats at its important Manhattan show on Nov. 19-20. Eighty-five rodents were placed on public display. Judged best mouse was a nameless black buck (above), owned by a Chicago doctor, which won a silver cup, a rosette inscribed "Best Mouse" and 40¢ in cash.

Moving spirit of this rodent exhibit was the Rev. Reginald Willoughby Ferrier (below), rector of the Episcopal Church of Stockport, N. Y., and founder in 1936 of the American Mouse Fanciers' Club. Mr. Ferrier imported his mice and his idea from England, where mouse fancying has gained great impetus in the past few years.
